



Success Criteria

Year 2 Summer 2 Week 1 – Measurement (Time)

When using success criteria, some objectives require a process and others are assessed through application of this knowledge and understanding in different contexts or problems.

- **Tell and write the time to five minutes, including quarter past/to the hour and draw the hands on a clock face to show these times.**

Process Success Criteria

- The long hand is the **minute hand** and the short hand is the **hour hand**.

- Count round clockwise in 5s from 12 (with 12 being 0) to say the number of minutes past the o'clock time.

- Count round in 5s anticlockwise from 12 (with 12 being 0) to say the number of minutes to the next o'clock time.

- When saying the time using the hour hand:

*if using **past** look at the number the hour hand has just passed;*

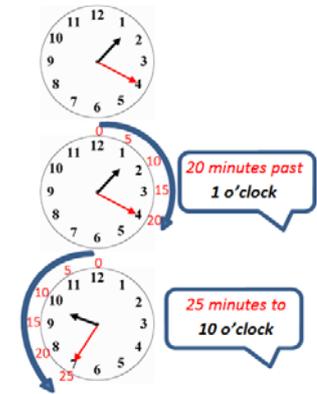
In the example at the top, the hour hand has just passed 1, so the time is ... minutes past 1 o'clock.

*if using **to** look at the next number the hour hand is moving towards.*

In the example at the bottom, the hour hand is moving towards 10, so the time is ... minutes to 10 o'clock.

- Use knowledge of rounding to decide whether it is closer to the last o'clock time or the next o'clock time.

- Use knowledge of fractions of circles to understand the way other times are said.



- **Know the number of minutes in an hour and the number of hours in a day.**

- Remember that there are:

60 minutes in 1 hour

24 hours in 1 day

NB Success with this learning will be related to the next objective.

- **Compare and sequence intervals of time.**

Process Success Criteria

- Compare and order the times that have the same units.

e.g. put these in order: 1 day, 30 hours, 80 minutes, 1 hour, 3 hours
30 hours 3 hours 1 hour

- Use knowledge of how many minutes in 1 hour and how many hours in 1 day to compare times with different units.

30 hours	1 day (24 hours)	3 hours	80 minutes (more than 1 hour)	1 hour
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
